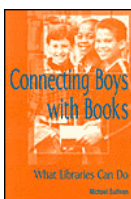


12:30 -2:00 Luncheon Speaker Tim Sample

Novelist Stephen King has likened Sample's work to that of Mark Twain, and Charles Kuralt called him "Maine's humorist laureate." Tim's books, albums, and videos have sold over a million copies. Tim appeared as a regular correspondent for the Emmy award winning TV show CBS News Sunday Morning.

11:15 – 12:15: Lee Wardlaw is the award-winning author of 24 books for children, ranging from toddler titles to teen novels. *101 Ways to Bug Your Parents* won numerous awards, including the 1999 CHILIS Great Stone Face Award and four other state children's choice awards. The sequel, *101 Ways to Bug Your Teacher*, was just honored as a Best Book of the Month by the National Council of Teachers of English and named a 2004-05 IRA/CBC Children's Choice Book.

2:00 -3:00 Sy Montgomery is an author, naturalist, newspaper columnist, documentary scriptwriter, and radio commentator who writes for children as well as adults. Among her award-winning books are ***The Snake Scientist*** and ***The Man-Eating Tigers of Sundarbans***. She made four expeditions to Peru and Brazil to study the pink dolphins of the Amazon. She lives here in New Hampshire.

3 :15 – 4:15 Rebecca Rule taught fiction writing and composition for several years at the University of New Hampshire, where she continues to teach in the Summer Studies Program for teachers. Her collection of stories, ***Wood Heat***, was published in 1992 by Nightshade Press of Troy, Maine. Twice nominated for the Pushcart Prize, her work has appeared in *The Christian Science Monitor, Yankee, Potato Eyes, Whetstone, New Hampshire Profiles*, and others.
